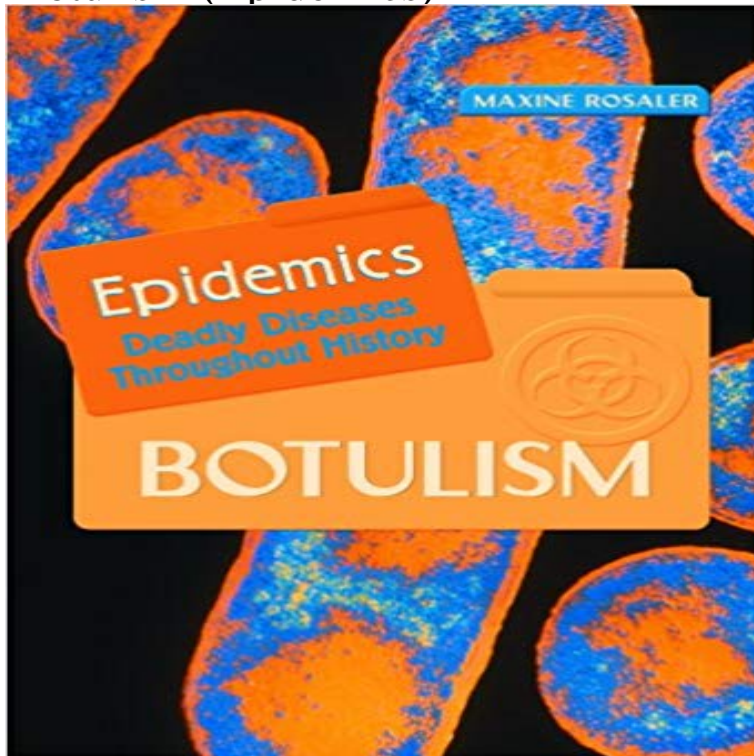


Botulism (Epidemics)
